# Statement by Supervisor Moore

The obligation of Grafton Township to Assessor Ottley is to provide him with adequate resources with which to properly assess the real estate parcels in Grafton Township. I believe that Grafton Township has done so.

I also believe that Grafton Township has the legal authority to budget money to spend remodeling his current office.

The problems with the matter are as follows: When it comes to letting bids on construction projects this is a township matter. As the duly elected Assessor, Mr. Ottley has no authority to let bids. In addition, I am unclear as to whether bids have been let in the proper fashion, whether bids have been received that pay prevailing wage, and whether Assessor Ottley has complied with applicable law. We do not have a township attorney who can clarify the matter for us. I am concerned that the township will be exposed to needless risk and exposure to suit without proper legal advice.

On top of that and perhaps more importantly, the township probably should not be improving a property for which it is paying rent. The building, for better or worse, is still owned by the Grafton Township Road District. Grafton Township Road District landlord, to whom we pay rent, should provide for much of what Assessor Ottley is trying to do.

I recommend the board vote no on this issue until we have a township attorney who can make sure bids let by the township can be in compliance with applicable law. For example, it could be argued that the additional construction coming in the Supervisor's office should have been bid at the same time as the assessor's project because it is all remodeling by the Grafton Township. To not allow a company paying prevailing wage on that construction could be construed as subterfuge whether it is or not.

It is for these reasons that this bid should be turned over to the office of the Supervisor, who will, on behalf of the township, request bids and bring the results to the board for its approval.
